






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INTRODUCTION

The University of Bahrain is committed to transparency and accountability in support of its goal to provide world-class teaching and learning. Student feedback is an essential element in the continuous quality improvement (CQI) system that the University has established. The course evaluation survey provides an institutional system for collecting feedback on key elements of teaching, learning, and student's experience. Feedback is obtained and utilized to improve academic courses and programs, learning environments, and teaching and learning. By publishing this report, we are committed to:



HOW DOES IT WORK

Each semester students rate the quality of our courses. Since 2016, the evaluation of courses has been conducted electronically via the Student Information System (SIS). In contrast to the classical paper-based course evaluation systems, this electronic system improved the flexibility of the evaluation by allowing students to undertake the survey anywhere and at any given time during the course evaluation survey period.

During the evaluation period, the students rate each course (section) they are enrolled in. The results of each section are aggregated, and a report for the section is generated. The aggregated results are grouped per faculty member to correlate the evaluation results with the performance of faculty members. Due to the nature of this evaluation, the identities of the students who participated in the course's evaluation survey are kept anonymous. All data is confidential, and only aggregated data is made available for improvement purposes. Every faculty member will be able to view their evaluation results. Additionally, the Head of Departments and Deans are granted access to view the results for their faculty members.

In addition to the online results available via SIS, this report provides overarching information about the first semester 2019 - 2020 course evaluation.

Satisfaction Rate

During the First Semester, 2019- 2020, 1,446 different courses offered over 3,905 sections in 9 colleges, the English Language Centre, Confucius Institute, and the French Studies Centre were included in the survey. These courses were taught by 854 full-time and part-time faculty members. Each student is eligible to cast his/her opinion for each enrolled section. The survey shows that the University satisfaction rate improved and achieved a positive 84% (4.21 / 5.0) satisfaction rate.

The survey evaluated the students' satisfaction with regard to:



RESPONSE RATE




The survey recorded a **45**% response rate, where **54,678** evaluation sheets out of **120,226** eligible evaluation were submitted surveys. The following are the top three colleges that recorded the highest survey response rate:

- Bahrain Teachers College
- College of Applied Studies
- College of Health and Sport Sciences

This response rate shows that a significant number of students participated in providing their feedback to improve the provisions at the University.

More than 96% of faculty members received an overall satisfaction rate of above 70%. This clearly shows the satisfaction of students with the quality of learning and teaching at the University. The University will continue its efforts into sustaining these positive results via its various quality assurance, professional development, and capacity building efforts. Furthermore, the University plans to offer the first postgraduate certificate in quality assurance and accreditation in the region. This qualification is anticipated to further contribute to the professional development of faculty members and the quality of provisions.


COLLEGES SATISFACTION RATE

The students showed an overall average satisfaction rate of 84%. Eleven (11) out of 12 entities of the University achieved overall satisfaction rates of 83% or above. In general, all entities received comparable satisfaction rates. Despite the College of Business Administration received the lowest satisfaction rate of 82%, this result is still within acceptable margins of the overall average satisfaction rates. SURVEY QUESTIONS RATE



KEY FINDINGS

- The University achieved an overwhelming positive satisfaction rate of 84% (4.21 / 5.0).
- Eleven (11) out of 12 entities of the University achieved overall satisfaction rates of 83% or above.
- The survey recorded a 45% response rate.
- The majority of faculty members (821) received an overall satisfaction rate of above 70%.
- Almost all of the entities received Excellent in all survey questions.
